Summary

- 1. Because of the reform, we do not have enough manpower. Without enough manpower, we stopped it.
- 2. Southwest Hospital did relatively more, and we did less back then.
- 3. Zhejiang Medical University and Shulang Hospital have more brain dead DCD liver donors.
- 4. West China Hospital in Chengdu also does a lot! Objectively speaking, West China Hospital does more than we do.
- 5. For liver transplants, Yang Jiayin of West China Hospital is doing them.
- 6. West China Hospital and Southwest Hospital are about the same, they are about the same in terms of the quantity.
- 7. Investigator: How long was the wait time for a liver donor, in a fast case? Huang Xiaobing: In a fast case, generally it took one to two weeks.

Translation

Investigator: Hello?

Huang Xiaobing: Hello!

Investigator: Hi greetings. How do you do, Doctor Huang? Hi, I'd like to ask, ah, regarding that...at yours, Xianqiao Hospital, are you still doing liver transplants?

Huang Xiaobing: Not now.

Investigator: Because my husband wants to get a liver transplant...they said your hospital did a good job. But you don't do it anymore, right?

Huang Xiaobing: Right. That is right. Liver sources are a problem now. With few resources available, we stopped doing it. Southwest Hospital does it. Southwest Hospital.

Investigator: You stopped it just recently?

Huang Xiaobing: Uh, it's been quite a while. You can directly contact Southwest Hospital, Hepatobiliary Surgery. They do it there.

Investigator: You said Southwest Hospital, right?

Huang Xiaobing: Right.

Investigator: Oh, so you, you will not do it at your hospital in the future?

Huang Xiaobing: En, for the time being. Because of the reform, we do not have enough manpower. Without enough manpower, we've stopped it.

Investigator: Oh. You don't have enough manpower due to the reform?

Huang Xiaobing: En, we've stopped it.

Investigator: You stopped it temporarily?

Huang Xiaobing: Yes, yes. Due to the military downsizing, we temporarily stopped it. Reduction in military personnel has left fewer resources, so we become too busy to do it.

Investigator: Oh, I see. My classmate asked me to look for...as he said, yes, you, Huang Xiaobing, and someone else named Li Jing?

Huang Xiaobing: Uh, yes.

Investigator: He said that you both did it. So, Li Jing also stopped doing it, right? Your whole hospital temporarily stopped it, right?

Huang Xiaobing: Right. We all stopped doing it for the time being. Because getting the liver sources requires manpower for their procurement, we just don't have the manpower.

Investigator: Oh...

Huang Xiaobing: We do not have the energy for this matter, Ah!

Investigator: Oh...so it's hard to find liver donors, right?

Huang Xiaobing: Right, because it has to go through the Red Cross Society only, we need to work with them. But we can hardly even cover our regular business, right now.

Investigator: Oh. So if, I think, I wanted to come over, with my husband, to get his examination done at your hospital.

Huang Xiaobing: But, what is his illness, what illness?

Investigator: Just a liver tumor.

Huang Xiaobing: Uh, is it liver cancer?

Investigator: Yes, it is.

Huang Xiaobing: How big is the tumor?

Investigator: For the tumor size, the doctor said that it was 6 or 7 centimeters, something like that.

Huang Xiaobing: Oh, doesn't he consider having a surgery, to get it excised?

Investigator: Surgery?

Huang Xiaobing: It can be done. But for a liver transplant, if the tumor size is larger than 5mm, the recurrence rate is relatively high. It depends on the tumor's positions. Some positions are not suitable for liver transplantation. Direct surgical removal also works.

Investigator: Oh, is that so? So I think maybe we should come over to get him examined. You assess his condition to see if you can do it. If you can, if he's suitable for the surgery, we will just come and get him admitted into your hospital once for all, with no need to go anywhere else. You know?

Huang Xiaobing: Ah, because sometimes it depends on the positions, at some positions, it doesn't require liver transplantation. It can be directly removed. Because if it is larger than 5mm, the recurrence rate is relatively high after a liver transplant is performed!

Investigator: Okay.

Huang Xiaobing: There are immunity drugs also at work. When it is large, it is easy to recur, very easy to relapse.

Investigator: Oh, is that so?

Huang Xiaobing: It depends on the positions of the tumor. At some positions, it cannot be done. It cannot be totally cured by surgery, due to its position. In such a case, liver transplantation is favorable. But at certain locations in the liver, for a tumor of 5mm, it's not considered very large, even for a direct surgery. In such a case, direct surgical removal may be a better choice than liver transplantation.

Investigator: Oh, because I have checked both hospitals.

Huang Xiaobing: Liver transplantation depends on the size, because the requirements must be met. 5mm is not very ideal. A size of 2 to 3 cm, within 5 cm, is relatively ideal. It depends on the position, the position. Because once it finds a way to migrate, other channels to migrate, it recurs very quickly after the liver transplant surgery. Because in liver transplantation we must use immunity drugs, using such drugs causes the tumor to grow explosively. Very soon it will fail.

Investigator: Oh, then...

Huang Xiaobing: In the past, a movie star named Fu Biao went through that problem. While in the operation, he suffered from a relapse. After his second surgery, he suffered from another relapse, because the immunity drugs cannot be avoided.

Investigator: Oh. Fu Biao had it done at your place?

Huang Xiaobing: No, no. He had it done in Tianjin.

Investigator: It was done in Tianjin. Then I...

Huang Xiaobing: At the Armed Police, Tianjin General Hospital of the Armed Police.

Investigator: It was done at the General Hospital of Armed Police?

Huang Xiaobing: En.

Investigator: In the past, you did it quite well, right? You did a lot, right? In the past.

Huang Xiaobing: Southwest Hospital did more. We did fewer.

Investigator: If we come over for an assessment, if he meets all the requirements, can you do it, if he's suitable?

Huang Xiaobing: We do not have the manpower. There are no resources here. Southwest is still doing it, so are other hospitals.

Investigator: If we come for a liver surgery, rather than a transplant, if we come for a different liver surgery, like surgical removal of...

Huang Xiaobing: That's for sure. That can be done, no problem.

Investigator: Oh, I see. So I'm wondering if there's a hospital that can do either liver transplantation, or surgical removal in case a liver transplant is not suitable--whichever is convenient or more suitable. I'd like to find such a hospital once for all. (Huang jumped in: That is fine.) So what you said...oh...what you said makes sense. It must be examined thoroughly.

Huang Xiaobing: Yes, yes, yes.

Investigator: How come tests done at two hospitals all match?

Huang Xiaobing: Where are you now? Which city?

Investigator: I'm from Zhejiang. We do business in your region in Chengdu.

Huang Xiaobing: To get a liver transplant done, to have a liver transplant done.

Investigator: Ah!

Huang Xiaobing: For patients in Zhejiang, there are more liver donors from brain dead DCD, while such donors from Chongqing are relatively fewer in number. In Zhejiang, both the First Zhejiang Hospital and Shulan Hospital have relatively more donors. There are relatively more donors there.

Investigator: But I...

Huang Xiaobing: Zhejiang Medical University and Shulan Hospital.

Investigator: He is still in the No. 452 Hospital in your area, in Chengdu, over there!

Huang Xiaobing: In Chengdu, in Chengdu, West China Hospital also does a lot.

Investigator: West China Hospital? Oh, you think Huaxi is relatively good, right?

Huang Xiaobing: West China Hospital and Southwest Hospital are both good! Both are quite good.

Investigator: They both are quite good.

Huang Xiaobing: Ah.

Investigator: So in the past when you did it, you did not do it as well as West China Hospital?

Huang Xiaobing: For the quantity, they did relatively more. In comparison, we didn't do as many cases here at our hospital. Objectively speaking, they did more at West China Hospital than we did here.

Investigator: Oh, is that so? Then West China Hospital?

Huang Xiaobing: West China Hospital and Southwest Hospital are about the same. Those two are about the same. They handle about the same quantities.

Investigator: How many can they do now, in a year?

Huang Xiaobing: That depends on the liver sources. Yang Jiayhin of West China Hospital, Yang Jiayin, is doing it. Yang Jiayin.

Investigator: Oh, the last name is Yang, right?

Huang Xiaobing: Ah, Right, right, right.

Investigator: So, Yang Jiayin, next time I will look for him. If I go there to consult with him, can I say that you recommended him? Can I say that?

Huang Xiaobing: That is fine, no problem.

Investigator: No problem. What's Yang's full name?

Huang Xiaobing: Yang Jiayin.

Investigator: Jia is which Jia?

Huang Xiaobing: Jia as in "Jiating", Yin as in "Gangyin".

Investigator: Jia as in "Jiating", right?

Huang Xiaobing: En, yes.

Investigator: How about Yin?

Huang Xiaobing: Yin is the print of a seal.

Investigator: Yin is the print of a seal, Yang Jiayin.

Huang Xiaobing: En, yes.

Investigator: Next time I will tell him that Doctor Huang Xiaobing referred him to me. Is that fine? I will go there, and contact them.

Huang Xiaobing: Okay.

Investigator: We will ask him to be more attentive to us, regarding whether the patient is suitable to have a liver transplant. If we're to get it done, we ask him to find a good liver donor. Is that okay?

Huang Xiaobing: Yes, fine, fine.

Investigator: Doctor Huang, as I said, if we're to get it done, what kind of liver sources are better? I've heard someone saying that they should be young or this or that. How can we find a good channel for the liver organ?

Huang Xiaobing: As of now, there are only DCD, brain dead donors, through the Red Cross Society. That's only one channel. There are no other channels.

Investigator: So, it has to go through the Red Cross Society, right?

Huang Xiaobing: Ah.

Investigator: Then if we approach the Red Cross Society and find some connection, will that be better? Maybe that can make a difference.

Huang Xiaobing: As for that...that consideration, it is hard to say. There must be a donor available. You'll need to contact West China Hospital, so they can coordinate for you by then.

Investigator: Oh, so generally, while you did it, how long did you have to wait before getting a liver donor, in a relatively fast case?

Huang Xiaobing: In a fast case, generally it took one to two weeks.

Investigator: One or two weeks, right?

Huang Xiaobing: En, en, en.

Investigator: No more than one or two weeks?

Huang Xiaobing: Usually, it was available every week.

Investigator: It was available every week, right?

Huang Xiaobing: Basically.

Investigator: As one of my relatives told me, according to him, he got a qigong practitioner. He said that if one gets a Falun Gong practitioner, it will be good. Are those still available?

Huang Xiaobing: Ah, regarding that, I don't know.

Investigator: You don't know? He ran across such cases that all went well. So I just think, he said that there are more such opportunities available in the army, there're more opportunities to get one like that there. So I think it's best to get that kind, so...

Huang Xiaobing: Ah...ah...en.

Investigator: Oh, that depends on luck, oh?

Huang Xiaobing: Oh, oh, yes.

Investigator: So generally, do you bring in the organs from outside, or the donors themselves? A donor is brought in and his organ is then extracted simultaneously, along with the transplant surgery?

Huang Xiaobing: How can that be done simultaneously?

Investigator: It cannot be done simultaneously, but it's just...

Huang Xiaobing: Okay.

Investigator: Bring it in?

Huang Xiaobing: Let's not discuss that.

Investigator: Okay, okay, okay. If I need to, I will ask for your help by then. Thank you very much.

Huang Xiaobing: No problem, no problem.

Investigator: No, I was talking about Doctor Yang. If I can find Doctor Yang, please say some good words on my behalf, to get a good one for me. Is that fine?

Huang Xiaobing: By that time you can coordinate with him.

Investigator: Okay, okay. Thank you then.

Huang Xiaobing: Now you...okay, good, bye.

Investigator: Okay, good. Thank you. Good bye!
