Content Briefing:

- 1. Close to 200 cases of kidney transplants done this year. More were done this year than last year.
- 2. Waiting time is about 3-4 months.
- 3. Donors are either young or older, that is the current status. It will depend on your luck if the donor kidney is a good one or bad one.
- 4. There is donor shortage, some people don't even have a poor quality kidney.

Content of Recording:

Investigator: Hello, how are you? Is this Wuhan University People's Hospital? Nurse: Yes.

Investigator: Hi, I have a friend who is currently in Japan. He called me to ask me to check if your hospital is still performing Kidney transplants.

Nurse: I see.

Investigator: So do you? Nurse: Oh, I see you are asking. Yes, our department is doing kidney transplants. Yes, yes.

Investigator: I see. He asked me to ask, how long is the wait time? He wants to do this at Wuhan University People's Hospital.

Nurse: Oh, could you wait for just a little bit? I will ask the Doctor to take the call, OK?

Investigator: Hello, how are you, doctor? I have a friend who would like to do kidney transplant at the Wuhan University People's Hospital. He asked me to make an inquiry if the hospital is doing transplant presently. What is current status, also how long is the waiting time. Doctor: What is his blood type?

Investigator: He is B-type. Doctor: OK, is he from Wuhan?

Investigator: He is from YiChan. Doctor: Oh, from YiChan. Where is he right now?

Investigator: He is in Japan now. Doctor: In Japan?

Investigator: He is a citizen of China. Working for a foreign company.

Doctor: I see, I see. It's like this. Our hospital is performing kidney transplant annually, well close to 200 cases this year so far. For B-types, waiting time is about 3 to 4 months. It's approximately that.

Investigator: I see, I see. Can it be sooner? If he comes back now, maybe not enough time to get it done by the year end?

Doctor: That depends, up to his luck. For type matching purposes, if there is a perfect match for him, he may be considered for priority.

Investigator: OK, that sounds good. Could you also tell me so I can tell him. what is the cost? Doctor: What?

Investigator: Yeah, the cost for the operation, Could you tell me so I can tell him how much it would cost him. Doctor: For cost he should plan on between 400K to 450K. About that much under normal circumstances.

Investigator: OK. Doctor: OK, is that all then?

Investigator: Yes, OK. Doctor: It's not necessary to talk about other details now.

Investigator: Are you the one doing the operation? Yourself? Doctor: We have many doctors in the department, this is not something that is done by one person.

Investigator: Oh, I see. It is because, since you are the doctor. Could he look for you? What is your last name? He can look for you.

Doctor: My name is Chen. He can come directly to the hospital, look for me in the department, OK either way.

Investigator: You said you did nearly two hundred cases so far, so may be able to do four hundred or five hundred cases for the year. Then he can get it done pretty quickly.

Doctor: Depends on luck, it all depends on luck.

Investigator: Could you say if you did more this year than last year? Doctor: Yes, that's the case. You shouldn't worry about this issue.

Investigator: Alright, Alright. I still want to ask you, part of the reason why he wants to do it in this hospital. Because seven or eight years ago, one of his friends did it there. He is wondering if he can use the organs from like from the prison, like the ones who do cultivations.... Doctor: No, no, no.

Investigator: OK, alright, I will tell him. Thank you so much. Good bye. Doctor: OK.
