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Summary

- 1. The wait time for liver transplant with type A blood should be within one month.
- 2. We do more than one hundred liver transplants each year.
- 3. We've done eighty to ninety liver transplants this year.
- 4. The whole country is almost the same now. Livers mainly come from voluntary donations.
- 5. Register with Director Wang Zhenxin at the outpatient clinic. People usually come to him for liver transplants.

Investigation Recording

Switchboard Operator: Go ahead, please. Investigator: Hello. Is this Huashan Hospital?

Switchboard Operator: Yes.

Investigator: Hey, please transfer me to the (Switchboard Operator: Yes, right.) Department of Kidney Transplant.

Switchboard Operator: The Department of Kidney Transplant? Investigator: Or can you please tell me the extensions of liver transplant and kidney transplant? I'll call myself. Otherwise, the call may be disconnected when being transferred.

Switchboard Operator: Seems like we only have a kidney ward. I don't know about liver and kidney transplant. Which one do you want? Investigator: Liver transplant. Switchboard Operator: We have liver transplant.

Investigator: Oh, then please transfer me to the liver transplant department. Switchboard Operator: We have liver transplant.

Investigator: Can you tell me the extension of liver transplant? Switchboard Operator: 7170. The extension is 7170.

(Transferring to extension) Nurse: Hello?

Investigator: Hello, how are you? Is this the Liver Transplant Department of Huashan Hospital? Nurse: Yes. How can I help you?

Investigator: Oh. We've got a patient who wants to transfer to your hospital. I'm wondering if you have vacant ward beds for liver transplant now.



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Nurse: Well, you need to register first. Our ward beds are always in short supply. You need to queue up at the outpatient clinic to see if you have the chance to be accepted. I cannot decide it. It isn't decided by the ward. Um, let me find a doctor to talk to you, okay?

Investigator: Oh, well, okay. Nurse: Hold on a minute. (Waiting.....) Doctor: Hello. How are you?

Investigator: Hello. Is this a liver transplant surgeon? Doctor: Right. Hi.

Investigator: Well, uh, we have a patient who, uh, just wants to ask if he comes here for a liver transplant, (Doctor: ok.) how long he has to wait?

Doctor: This is hard to say. We need to look at his blood type first.

Investigator: His blood type is A. Doctor: For type A, he may need to wait a bit longer.

Investigator: How long do you think it'll be? Doctor: While, it's hard to say how long it will take, because...

Investigator: Roughly how long? He needs to prepare the expenses, um. Doctor: Oh, it depends on his luck. Roughly, **he should be able to (get a liver transplant) within one month anyway.**

Investigator: Oh, and what's more, he...the patient wants to see which hospital has a better performance as he must be responsible for his life. At least he needs to know (Doctor: yes,) how many transplants you do per year. I'll tell him about it so he can rest assured.

Doctor: More than one hundred per year.

Investigator: Oh, what about this year? How many have been done this year? Doctor: (We've done) about eighty to ninety liver transplants this year.

Investigator: Is there a **death rate**?

Doctor: Heh heh, **should be none**. Which place do you want to choose? You can take a look at the hospitals in Shanghai, such as Zhongshan Hospital, Huashan Hospital, Eastern Hepatobiliary Surgery Hospital, Shanghai Changzheng Hospital, etc. All of them can do it. Then you can stay in those hospitals to make a comprehensive comparison. You'd better go to see at the outpatient clinic.

Investigator: How about the quality of the livers. That is, generally ...

Doctor: The liver quality must be very good. I cannot tell you this ... Because now the whole country is almost the same. Yes. The livers mainly come from voluntary donations.

Investigator: Oh, oh.

Doctor: It's like this. Then, you'd better come to see the specific situation yourself.



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Investigator: Also, which doctor is the chief surgeon for liver transplants? Which doctor is better? Please suggest me one.

Doctor: You may register with Director Wang Zhenxin.

Investigator: Wang? Doctor: Wang Zhenxin.

Investigator: Director Wang Zhenxin?

Doctor: You can look it up online yourself. His information should be included in the introduction to Huashan Hospital. People usually come to him for liver transplants. You'd better register with him at the outpatient clinic.

Investigator: Oh, okay. Oaky. Doctor: Let them take a look.
