



## A Liver Transplant Surgeon at Huashan Hospital, Fudan University, Shanghai

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### Summary

1. Director Wang Zhengxin is the main surgeon of liver transplants.
2. We do more than two hundred liver transplants each year. This year we've done nearly two hundred.
3. There will be more liver transplants this year than last year.

### Investigation Recording
