### **Summary**

### **Investigation Recording**

He is not specifically in charge of patients either. We are...the whole thing...because he is the president of the hospital, so he is not specifically in charge of patients, okay.

Investigator: Okay, I meant to say, the more he does, the better his skills will be.

Nurse: There is no problem with our second-line surgeries. They are all done individually and independently. We have been doing them here for more than 30 years. Alright?

Investigator: Oh, I would like to ask how many teams are doing it? How many doctors do it?

Nurse: You-you don't need to know so much details, because the surgeries...when they schedule surgeries they have a chief surgeon, a first assistant, and a second assistant, so you don't need to know this. Do you understand?

Investigator: Oh, okay, okay.

Nurse: You just come and everything would be fine. You don't need to know the specific number of people at the operating table. They will have everything arranged for you. Alright?

Investigator: Okay. And how long do we have to wait? I mean, when we finish registration, how long do we have to wait?

Nurse: What do you mean by how long you have to wait? Let's say, if you make an appointment for next Monday, you can go see the doctor next Monday. You don't have to wait.

Investigator: Oh.

Nurse: How long do you want to wait?

Investigator: Oh, I mean, after the examination is done, if there's a need for surgery, do we still have to wait in line? Do we still have to wait for a kidney donation?

Nurse: I don't even know what aspect you are referring to? After seeing the doctor, you have to come to the inpatient department for hospitalization. You can do the examination only after you are admitted into the hospital. Understand?

Investigator: Yes, about waiting for a kidney source, I mean, waiting for a kidney source. About that, how long can that waiting be...

Nurse: Can we cut a long story short?

Investigator: Yes, I just wanted to ask, how long do we have to wait after the examination is completed?

Nurse: I am unable to tell you that, do you understand? It depends on how your matching goes. Oh, with some people, it will be fast if they are matched well, and if they are not matched well, it'll have to be postponed until later.
